They will write diary entries for a three-day rainforest journey from a Rainforest Aboriginal perspective and present an entry from one or more of these diaries as a performance. Students will also produce a written discussion on a topical issue to do with the Wet Tropics World Heritage Area.

1. Investigate any changes in jobs, lifestyle, attitudes, appreciation of wildlife, Aboriginal cultural values, and tourism as a result of World Heritage listing.
