Making a map

- 1. Talk about plans and maps:
 - What are they used for?
 - Why do people use them?
 - Who uses them? (eg. a builder, a landscape gardener, a traveller)
- 2. Look at real maps and plans of the classroom, school grounds, surrounding area or routes to be taken.
- 3. Look at garden plans in gardening books.
- 4. Help students to identify places they know on maps.
- 5. Take several excursions into the school grounds.
- 6. Make maps together as a class.
- 7. Follow routes marked on the maps made by students.
- 8. Have a large and varied supply of materials available for students to create.
- 9. Allow students time to discuss how they would draw a map, plot routes and experiment with different materials.
- 10. Allow students to revisit their maps over and over again as their understanding increases.
