Tropical rainforests are one of three major types of rainforest found in Australia. In fact all three types of rainforest found in Australia have all been listed as World Heritage Areas. They are: Tropical Rainforest, Subtropical Rainforest and Temperate Rainforest. The following areas have been listed as World Heritage sites because of the importance of their rainforests:

- Wet Tropics
- Central Eastern Rainforest Reserves
- Tasmanian Wilderness.
