- 2) An understanding of the unique natural and cultural values of the Wet Tropics region and a commitment to their management, protection and presentation.
- 3) Contribution of stated skills (in the Terms of Reference) that can support the delivery of the Wet Tropics Strategic Plan 2020-2030, Wet Tropics Plan for People and Country, Terrain NRM Strategic Plan 2021-2026, and programs of the Wet Tropics Management Authority and Terrain NRM. Expertise in one area or a general knowledge/skills of many areas will be considered favourably.
- 4) Demonstrated skills in partnerships and communication.
- 5) A considered and professional approach to discussing issues, both technical and emotive, and the ability to work cooperatively with others to reach consensus.
- 6) Availability to attend four to six meetings per annum.
- 7) Ability to positively participate in the promotion of the Wet Tropics Management Authority and Terrain NRM.
