4.2 Rezoning of a section of Powerlink's Ingham to Tully electricity transmission line corridor and rezoning of the old Wujal Wujal dump site (Monday 2.30pm to 3.00pm)

Max Chappell and Bruce Jennison addressed the Board.

- Approved a rezoning process amend the Wet Tropics zoning from zone B to Zone C to allow for potential housing and community infrastructure development on the old dump site at the Wujal Wujal Aboriginal Community (Lot 2 on SP171837) within the Wet Tropics World Heritage Area.
- Noted that the procedure for amending a zoning map under section 8 of the Wet Tropics Management Plan 1998 requires public notification and Governor in Council approval as specified in sections 44 to 47 of the Wet Tropics Protection and Management Act 1993.

5.1 Situation and Issues Report – World Heritage Presentation (Monday 12.20pm to 12.55pm)

Paul Chantrill addressed the meeting and provided updates on relevant issues including:
